- _____ A recent credit report provided by Weller Law, LLC.
- _____ Credit Counseling Agency for Bankruptcy Certification
- _____ Federal Tax Returns including all W-2s (_____)
- _____ Copy of driver's license and social security card
- _____ Pay Stubs for the last 6 months for you and your spouse even if spouse is not filing with you. Bring all other documentation of household income, such as child support, Social Security, pension, disability, unemployment, public assistance, etc.
- _____ The latest copy of your bills (1 copy) or collection letters for all
- _____ Copies of any pending lawsuits, wage garnishments, wage assignments or other legal actions, including foreclosure lawsuits pertaining to real estate regardless of whether you are Plaintiff or Defendant
- _____ Copy of all installment loan documents, such as vehicle loans or vehicle leases, furniture purchases, jewelry purchases or other secured loans
- _____ Copy of most recent real estate tax bill for each property you own or are buying; you can obtain a copy from your County Treasurer
- _____ If you are buying or selling real estate on contract for deed, bring a copy of each contract you have entered into and a real estate tax bill for each property
- _____ If you have had an appraisal of your real estate in the past 5 years, bring it
- _____ Your checking and savings account bank statements for the past 3 months
- _____ Copy of the declaration page of vehicle insurance policy for each vehicle
- _____ If you have been participating in a credit counseling repayment plan in the last year, we need a copy of the plan
- _____ The latest copy of most recent statements for IRAs, 401Ks, brokerage accounts, mutual funds, educational IRAs, state tuition programs, medical savings accounts, any other investments
- _____ Copies of court Orders regarding current child support, maintenance, and arrearages
- _____ Copies of divorce property settlement agreements and Orders
